This is a commercial product whose exact ratio of components may vary slightly. Minor quantities of other non hazardous ingredients are also possible.

The TWA exposure value is the average airborne concentration of a particular substance when calculated over a normal 8 hour working day for a 5 day working week. The STEL (Short Term Exposure Limit) is an exposure value that should not be exceeded for more than 15 minutes and should not be repeated for more than 4 times per day. There should be at least 60 minutes between successive exposures at the STEL. Section 4 - First Aid Measures

General Information:

Section 6 - Accidental Release Measures

Section 7 - Handling and Storage

Handling: Keep exposure to this product to a minimum, and minimise the quantities kept in work areas. No special equipment is usually needed when occasionally handling small quantities. Section 10 - Stability and Reactivity

Reactivity: This product is unlikely to react or decompose under normal storage conditions. However, if you have any doubts, contact the supplier for advice on shelf life properties.

Conditions to Avoid: Store in the closed original container in a dry, cool, well-ventilated area out of direct sunlight. **Incompatibilities:** strong oxidising agents.

Fire Decomposition: Carbon dioxide, and if combustion is incomplete, carbon monoxide and smoke. Nitrogen and its compounds, and under some circumstances, oxides of nitrogen. Occasionally hydrogen cyanide gas. Water. Carbon monoxide poisoning produces headache, weakness, nausea, dizziness, confusion, dimness of vision, disturbance of judgment, and unconsciousness followed by coma and death. Hydrogen cyanide poisoning signs and symptoms are weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea, vomiting, coma, convulsions, and death. Death results from respiratory arrest. Hydrogen cyanide gas acts very rapidly; symptoms and death can both occur quickly.

Polymerisation: This product is unlikely to undergo polymerisation processes.

Section 11 - Toxicological Information

No LD₅₀ available for the product. However, for the constituent, TRALKOXYDIM:

Oral LD₅₀ (rat, female): 934 mg/kg.

Dermal LD₅₀ (rat): >2000 mg/kg.

Inhalation LC₅₀ (rat): >3.5 mg/L/4hr. (limit dose-no deaths)

SKIN: Mild irritant (rabbit). Not a skin sensitiser (guinea pig).

EYES: Mild irritant (rabbit).

Studies in animals have shown that tralkoxydim is not mutagenic nor carcinogenic. Benign leydig cell tumours were observed in a rat study but this is believed not to represent a hazard in man.

A reproductive study in the rat has shown that repeated doses produce no adverse reproductive effects

(multigenerational study). Studies in animals have shown that high doses produce teratogenic effects in the presence of severe maternal toxicity (rats not rabbits).

Tralkoxydim solubility is increased with increasing pH.

At pH5 5 mg/L), at pH6.5 (6.7 mg/L) and at pH9 (9800 mg/L).

Tralkoxydim is a solid of low volatility which has low mobility in soil. It degrades rapidly in crops and soil, with half lives between 3 days (aerobic) and 25 days (flooded soil).

Disposal: Instructions concerning the disposal of this product and its containers are given on the product label. These should be carefully followed.

Section 14 - Transport Information

ADG Code: This product is not classified as a Dangerous Good. No special transport conditions are necessary unless required by other regulations.
